**• DISCUSSION & POSSIBLE ACTION ON RESOLUTION TO APPROPRIATE \$12,325,000 FOR VARIOUS TOWN PROJECTS**

A **MOTION** was offered, by Francis Masi, seconded by Charles Marsella, to **adopt** the following resolution; **RESOLUTION TO APPROPRIATE \$12,325,000 FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR OF VARIOUS TOWN ROADS AND ROADSIDE ELEMENTS, UPGRADES TO THE WOLCOTT PUBLIC SCHOOLS, WATERLINE REPLACEMENT ON LOWER WOODTICK ROAD, CONSTRUCTION OF A WALKING TRAIL AT SCOVILL RESERVOIR AND PURCHASE OF A NEW FIRE TRUCK, AND TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUE OF BONDS, NOTES OR TEMPORARY NOTES IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$12,325,000 TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION (#338, see attached).**

Chairman Santogatta stated that everyone has had an opportunity to research this issue. He noted that a majority vote is required to approve the above appropriation, which is five affirmative votes. Attorney Chudwick next provided clarification of the three resolutions. Discussion and comments followed.

- **DISCUSSION & POSSIBLE ACTION ON RESOLUTION TO SUBMIT TO REFERENDUM THE RESOLUTION TO APPROPRIATE \$12,325,000 FOR VARIOUS TOWN PROJECTS**

A **MOTION** was offered, by Francis Masi, seconded by Charles Marsella, to **adopt** the following resolution; **RESOLUTION TO SUBMIT TO REFERENDUM THE RESOLUTION TO APPROPRIATE \$12,325,000 FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR OF VARIOUS TOWN ROADS AND ROADSIDE ELEMENTS, UPGRADES TO THE WOLCOTT PUBLIC SCHOOLS, WATERLINE REPLACEMENT ON LOWER WOODTICK ROAD, CONSTRUCTION OF A WALKING TRAIL AT SCOVILL RESERVOIR AND PURCHASE OF A NEW FIRE TRUCK, AND TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUE OF BONDS, NOTES OR TEMPORARY NOTES IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$12,325,000 TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION, AS APPROVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL (#339, see attached).**

Lengthy discussion followed with respect to having one question as stated in the resolution or splitting the question into different projects; comments were made with respect to the pros and cons of each. Attorney Chudwick provided clarification of the resolution and also stated that if the question were split, that the costs for the projects would change. Contained in the resolution, the financing and bonding costs are lumped together based on all of the projects. They would have to allocate that somehow to each of the three individual questions and new resolutions would need to be drawn up. He also noted that if the projects were split, another option is to send them to a Town Meeting; a simple majority vote is required for that. He noted that in the past the Town has sent smaller projects to a Town Meeting. Chairman Santogatta advised that an amendment to split the question would require a simple majority, which would be five affirmative votes; it would then take a super majority of eight affirmative votes to send each question to referendum. If the amendment fails they will revert

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back to the main motion. Debate continued with respect to the question contained in the resolution.

An **amendment** was offered by Michael Bokon, seconded by David Valletta, to **split** the question provided in resolution #339 into three separate questions containing the following projects: 1. Road Reconstruction 2. Waterline on Lower Woodtick Road and Upgrades to Wolcott Public Schools 3. Walking Trail and and Fire Truck.

Attorney Tynan concurred and advised that anyone can second the motion.

Upon **MOTION** by Michael Bokon, seconded by Gale Mastrofrancesco, it was unanimously voted to **reconsider** the main motion.

Upon **MOTION** by Charles Marsella, seconded by Michael Perrone, it was unanimously voted to **move** the question.

Chairman Santogatta next called for a vote on the main motion.

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- **DISCUSSION & POSSIBLE ACTION ON RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE TOWN TO PREPARE AND PRINT AN EXPLANATORY TEXT OF THE REFERENDUM QUESTION**

Upon **MOTION** by Rachel Wisler, seconded by Gale Mastrofrancesco, it was unanimously voted to **authorize** the Town to prepare and print an explanatory text of the referendum question (**#340, see attached**).

- **DISCUSSION & POSSIBLE ACTION ON CONTRACT FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF TOSUN ROAD**

Mayor Dunn came forward and gave a brief overview of the project, and explained how the grant monies work. He advised that they went out to bid, and that Cocchiola was the low bidder who was awarded the bid.

Mrs. Wisler referred to page 5 of the bid comparison, and questioned the \$400,000 difference for a lump sum payment for mobilization between the two bidders (**see attached**). Mayor Dunn explained the bidding process and how different companies bid. Mrs. Bruce noted that the State has reviewed the bid results and have approved Cocchiola. Attorney Tynan noted that the contract goes into greater detail as to how the company is to be paid. Discussion followed.

A **MOTION** was offered by David Valletta, seconded by Francis Masi, to **approve** the contract for Cocchiola Paving for the Tosun Road Project (**on file**).

A question and answer period was held and discussion continued with respect to the bid process.

Chairman Santogatta asked for all in favor of the above motion. The above motion **carried** unanimously by voice vote.

**WOLCOTT TOWN COUNCIL**

**RESOLUTION TO APPROPRIATE \$12,325,000 FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR OF VARIOUS TOWN ROADS AND ROADSIDE ELEMENTS, UPGRADES TO THE WOLCOTT PUBLIC SCHOOLS, WATERLINE REPLACEMENT ON LOWER WOODTICK ROAD, CONSTRUCTION OF A WALKING TRAIL AT SCOVILL RESERVOIR AND PURCHASE OF A NEW FIRE TRUCK, AND TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUE OF BONDS, NOTES OR TEMPORARY NOTES IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$12,325,000 TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION**

BE IT RESOLVED:

SECTION 1. That the Town of Wolcott appropriate \$12,325,000 for costs related to the reconstruction and repair of various Town roads and roadside elements, including associated drainage facilities, sidewalks and pedestrian ramps; upgrades to the Wolcott Public Schools, including a water main, fire alarm system, bleachers and a gymnasium floor for Wolcott High School and a fire alarm system for Wakelee School; replacement of 850 feet of waterline on Lower Woodtick Road, including related water laterals; construction of a walking trail at Scovill Reservoir; and the purchase of a new fire truck. The appropriation may be expended for acquisition of land and/or rights or interests in land, site improvements, design, renovation, construction, reconstruction, repair, excavation, inspection, evaluation and surveying costs, equipment, furnishings and materials, professional fees, and for administrative, financing and bond issuance costs, interest expense for temporary borrowings and other costs related to the projects, for all of the projects, all in the amounts as follows:

Reconstruction and repair costs for roads and roadside elements	\$9,000,000
Upgrades to Wolcott Public Schools	1,800,000
Waterline on Lower Woodtick Road	350,000
Walking Trail at Scovill Reservoir	350,000
Purchase of new fire truck	500,000
Administrative, Financing and Bond Issuance Costs	<u>325,000</u>
TOTAL	\$12,325,000

The appropriation shall include any federal, state or other grants-in-aid or other funds received for the projects. The amount authorized to be expended for each purpose shall not exceed the amount set forth opposite each purpose, provided that the Town Council may, by

resolution, transfer unexpended funds among purposes, so long as the total appropriation and bond authorization is not increased.

SECTION 2. That the Town of Wolcott finance the appropriation by issuing the Town's bonds or notes in an amount not to exceed \$12,325,000 which bonds or notes shall be issued pursuant to the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended. The bonds or notes may be sold as a single issue or consolidated with any other authorized issues of bonds or notes of the Town. The Treasurer shall keep a record of the bonds or notes. The bonds or notes shall be signed in the name and on behalf of the Town by the Mayor and Treasurer and shall bear the Town seal or a facsimile thereof. The bonds or notes shall each recite that every requirement of law relating to its issue has been fully complied with, that such bond or note is within every debt and other limit prescribed by law, and that the full faith and credit of the Town are pledged to the payment of the principal thereof and the interest thereon. The terms, details and particulars of such bonds or notes shall be determined by the Mayor and Treasurer. The bonds or notes shall be sold by the Mayor and Treasurer at public sale or by negotiation in their discretion. If the bonds or notes are sold by negotiation, the purchase agreement shall be approved by the Town Council.

SECTION 3. That the Mayor and Treasurer are authorized to issue temporary notes in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of said bonds or notes. The notes shall be signed by the Mayor and Treasurer and shall bear the Town seal or a facsimile thereof. The notes shall be issued with maturity dates in accordance with the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended. The notes shall each recite that every requirement of law relating to its issue has been fully complied with, that such note is within every debt and other limit prescribed by law, and that the full faith and credit of the Town are pledged to the payment of the principal thereof and the interest thereon. The net interest cost on such notes, including renewals thereof, and the expense of preparing, issuing, and marketing such notes, to the extent paid from the proceeds from the issuance of bonds or notes, shall be included as a cost of the appropriation.


SECTION 4. That the Town hereby declares its official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, that the project costs may be paid from temporary advances of available funds and that the Town reasonably expects to reimburse any such advances from the proceeds of borrowings in an aggregate principal amount not in excess of the amount of borrowing authorized for the projects; that the Mayor and Treasurer are authorized to bind the Town pursuant to such representations and agreements as they deem necessary or advisable in order to ensure and maintain the continued exemption from Federal income taxation of interest on the bonds, notes or temporary notes authorized by this resolution, if issued on a tax-exempt basis, including covenants to pay rebates of investment earnings to the United States in future years; and that the Mayor and Treasurer are authorized to make representations and agreements for the benefit of the holders of the bonds, notes or temporary notes to provide secondary market disclosure information and to execute and deliver on behalf of the Town an agreement to provide such information with such terms and conditions as they, with the advice of bond counsel, deem necessary and appropriate.

SECTION 5. That the Mayor is authorized to apply for and accept any federal, state or other grants-in-aid for the projects and to contract with the contractors and others on behalf of the Town to complete the projects; and that the Town Council, Mayor, Treasurer and other Town officials and employees are authorized to take all actions necessary and proper to carry out the projects and to issue the bonds, notes or temporary notes to finance the appropriation.






