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- They will be working on putting numbers together for FEMA from the blizzard from the prior week; at this time, the Governor has set a 48 hour window for reimbursement of expenses; the Town chooses which 48 hours to submit; this may change at a later date
 - It was a very difficult storm for the Town Crew to keep up with and at times there was no visibility at all, but they did a great job; his office received some complaints from residents, but also many compliments
 - They continue to work on the budget and are finishing up with department budget meetings; the State of CT budget is still undetermined

Several Council Members complimented the Mayor on the tremendous job that the Town Crew did and also thanked him for all of his personal help throughout the storm by being out with them and coming to aid of many townspeople in need.

A brief question and answer period was held followed by comments and discussion. The following was noted:

- An excellent job was done with the use of the side plow during the blizzard; Mayor Dunn noted that there is footage of the operation of the wing plow being used on www.wxedge.com
- Mr. Kalinowski started calling around early and was able to lock in about 10 payloaders for help to move the snow

FINANCE OFFICER'S REPORT/TRANSFERS:

Linda Bruce came forward and reported the following:

- Blum, Shapiro has been notified that they were appointed by the Town Council as the auditing firm for FY ending June 30, 2013
- The bids were opened on February 13th and 14th for the Insurance Agents of Record for liability, workers' compensation, and medical benefits insurance for General Government and the Board of Education; also included in the RFP for liability and workers' compensation is insurance for the Wolcott Fire Depts.; interviews will be scheduled with the responding agencies; the Town may select multiple Insurance Agents of Record to service the various insurance packages; the current contracts expire June 30, 2013
- There are no transfers for approval

Mrs. Wisler referenced the Family Medical & Leave Act that was passed in 2011, and questioned if it, in any way, has affected the Town of Wolcott.

With respect to school security since the Sandy Hook tragedy, Mr. Macary and Mrs. Najarian discussed some of the enhanced security procedures. He noted that the buildings are locked at all times when school is in session and two panic buttons have been installed in all of the schools. Brief discussion followed.

2012: A Banner Year for the Wolcott Public Schools

This time of the year, everyone looks forward to the New Year by making resolutions and striving to make themselves better and the world around them better to live. It is also important to reflect back on where we began, where we are, and where we are headed. This time of reflection has made my thoughts dwell on the Charles Dickens quote from a Tale of Two Cities, "It was the best of times, it was the worst of times."

Every parent, guardian, and educator has the Newtown tragedy in our hearts, thoughts, and minds. The safety and security of our students in schools has changed forever. Our innocence and belief that children are always safe has been shattered. I am sure that this tragedy will have lasting effects on public education for years to come.

As 2012 comes to an end, one cannot help, but to reflect on the past year. When I started as Superintendent of Schools, the Board Chairman said to me, "we want to put Wolcott on the map in terms of education and what we do." At first, I thought that meant to be in the newspaper a lot, but experience and wisdom tells me, it's more important than that. It's having the respect of the townspeople of Wolcott and the respect of other districts as well. *Education is our Children's Future*, proudly, I can say that we have progressed toward that goal in 2012, a banner year for our schools.

Here are some of the accomplishments that we are proud of, this past year:

- ConnCAN, (the Connecticut Coalition for Achievement Now), an education reform organization that advocates for equity in schools ranked Wolcott 13th out of 133 districts in elementary education in terms of overall student performance.
- In the ConnCAN Top 10 school awards, Wakelee Elementary ranked in the Top 10 (5) for Performance Gains among all Elementary School in CT. Wolcott HS ranked in the Top 10 (3) for low-income student performances as compared to all the High Schools.

- Frisbie Elementary School received the 2012 Governor's Summer Reading Challenge Award for the amount of books that were read, overall school participation, and the quality of literacy in our school culture.
- Tyrrell Middle School received the CAS (Connecticut Association of Schools) School Climate Award 2010-2012 for having a positive learning environment and an innovative approach to discipline, learning and atmosphere.
- At Wolcott High School, every student in the Advanced Placement Art, Calculus and English classes, passed their AP exams with a score of 3 or better, getting college credit.
- At Wolcott High School 100 students were selected to the NVL (Naugatuck Valley League) all-Academic Team, which honors athletes and their scholarship ability.
- The Wolcott High School Cheerleading Team won the NVL and Class M State Championship this past year.
- The State recognized 16 juniors as CAPT Scholars in 2012. These students scored in the top level (advanced) in all four areas (reading, writing, science and math) on the CAPT.
- The Wolcott Public Schools was awarded the United Way Spirit of Excellence Award in 2010 for its generosity and volunteerism and United Way Top 50 Contributor for 2012.
- Joseph Monroe was honored by the Connecticut High School Coaches Association as the 2011-2012 Athletic Director of the Year for his leadership and advocacy of interscholastic athletics.
- Robert Nagashima was honored as the CAS (Connecticut Association of Schools) by receiving the Outstanding First Year Principalship awards. This award recognizes principals who demonstrate exemplary instructional and organizational leadership, a willingness to take risks, and the ability to overcome adversity.
- Wolcott Public Schools again scored at the top of its DRG (District Reference Group-F) on the CAPT (Connecticut Academic Performance Test) and CMT (Connecticut Mastery Tests) in the areas of Reading, Writing, Mathematics and Science.
- The following grade levels scored 100% proficiency (i.e. all students in that grade passed the CMT with a 3 or better):
 - Alcott Grade 3 in Writing
 - Wakelee Grade 3 in Writing
 - Alcott Grade 4 in Writing
 - Alcott Grade 4 in Mathematics
 - Frisbie Grade 5 in Writing
- In the twenty-four areas of state testing on the Connecticut Mastery Tests (CMTs) and Connecticut Academic Performance Test (CAPT) – there were over ninety (90%) percent of students, in the Level 3 (proficiency) band and above, in **22 out of 24 subject areas**.
- The Wolcott Board of Education received four Communication Awards from CABE (Connecticut Association of Boards of Education). The top award was for the WHS Agenda Planner and three honorable mentions for the Annual Report of the




